- 1. We are happy to announce that we were able to give five \$1000 scholarships this year and hope to so it again next year. We also want create a committee to review and bring up to date scholarship criteria.
- 2. Taxes are paid and up to date.
- 3. We are considering having three two show weekends next season. We tried two last season and things went well.
- 4. Purchases for 2015 include a new set up for two shows on the same weekend.
